Criteria, Profile, Commitment and Selection Process

Membership criteria for the experts

- Membership is individual.
- Membership is by invitation only.
- Members are committed to the criteria for participation and they are invited because they are engaged with organizations or sister networks in the field and/or by national or regional governments.
- Members of EE-HUB will be individually recognized on the website. The number of members is capped at 60. Only members of EE-HUB will be invited to EE-HUB (subsidized) meetings.

Member Profile

- Well-known internationally in the entrepreneurship education field for their contributions and leadership; solid track record.
- Able to identify and disseminate useful examples of policy and/or practice from different countries.
- Able to be an effective multiplier and willing to reach out across their own networks and complementary networks.

Member Commitment

- Provide a description of expertise area, a CV, short bio and a photo
- Attend the network's 3 main face-to-face meetings
- Contribute voluntarily and actively to at least 1 work stream
- Write 1 blog and submit at least 1 good practice description.
- Contribute voluntarily and actively to dissemination and outreach efforts
- Attendance required to be 80% (face-to-face + working group meetings)

Procedures for recruiting new members

The EE-HUB shall reflect the size and scope of Europe's entrepreneurial learning community and contribute to successfully complete the tasks in the 5 working groups established when launching the project. By decision of the steering group, new members can be introduced to the network and/or new working groups can be established during the project period.

The purpose of recruiting new members to the network is:

- To strengthen need for competences and knowledge based on mapping of the existing network
- To balance the sector representation
- To support lack of manpower in certain work streams
- To support new areas and field of work in the network
