Successful Mid-Term Meeting with EE-HUB Experts!

28-29 January, Brussels

The experts in the EE-HUB met for the second time in Brussels on the **28th - 29th of January** to consolidate the work they have been doing so far on **59 Good Practices!** Moreover, the experts started to discuss and brainstorm on **policy recommendations** that the EE-HUB will put forward to deliver on the 2020 strategy goal: "every young person to have at least one practical entrepreneurial experience before leaving compulsory education, such as running a mini-company, being responsible for an entrepreneurial project for a company or a social project."



MEP Martina Dlabajova expressed her support to experts and reiterated her dedication to match skills & jobs in Europe. "Cooperation between business and education works but should be increased," she added.

Simone Baldassarri from the European Commission attended the meeting and encouraged "experts to become ambassadors of entrepreneurship education and help Member States to implement entrepreneurship education strategies".

2016 and 2017 Peer Learning Events in EE-HUB

During 2016 and 2017 EE-HUB consortium members will run over 26 peerlearning events that aim to encourage and motivate different stakeholders to persevere in increasing the uptake of entrepreneurship education in Europe.

- Over **15 Targeted Webinars** will gather smaller groups from the entrepreneurship education ecosystem (like teachers, businesses, researchers, national/regional authorities, etc) around specific topics, where experts from the HUB will be sharing relevant good practices gathered by the network.
- During the **6 High-level Roundtables** national ministries and policy makers will come together and participate in a discussion around the main policy recommendations put forward by the EE-HUB.
