**Conference on migrant entrepreneurship**

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The conference was chaired by Mr Michel Catinat, Head of Unit for Clusters, Social Economy and Entrepreneurship, European Commission, Directorate General for Internal Market, Industry, Entrepreneurship and SMEs. The objective of the conference was to present and coordinate initiatives from the parliament and the Commission to support migrant entrepreneurship. They also invited the participants to provide input to the study currently under way: Evaluation and Analysis of Good Practices in Promoting and Supporting Migrant Entrepreneurship (to be concluded in July).

**Eurydice Report: Entrepreneurship Education at School in Europe**

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This report provides updated information on strategies, curricula and learning outcomes on entrepreneurship education in 33 countries across Europe. It mentions JA 39 times, ICEE and good practices at national level.

**EPRS briefing - 'Integrating migrants and their children through education'**

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The CULT committee is currently discussing a draft report on the follow-up of the Strategic Framework for European cooperation in education and training (ET 2020) in which it dedicates a chapter to the education of migrants. It suggests that education ministries and the Commission's Education and Culture DG designate dedicated contact persons; it also calls for other measures that support teachers, facilitate integration, prevent radicalisation and validate qualifications.

**'A New Skills Agenda for Europe' coming up**

'A New Skills Agenda for Europe' is expected to be launched on 25 May 2016, aimed at promoting lifelong investment in people and increasing employability. The initiative will cover areas such as skills development, improving the transparency of qualifications, and addressing skills gaps and skills mismatches.
